To the Members of S.D. ECOTECH PRIVATE LIMITED

Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying standalone financial statements of S.D. ECOTECH PRIVATE LIMITED ('the Company'), which comprise the Balance Sheet as at 31st March, 2025, the Statement of Profit and Loss for the year ended, and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid standalone financial statements give the information required by the Companies Act, 2013 ('the Act') in the manner so required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the Indian Accounting standards prescribed under section 133 of the Act read with Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015, as amended, and other accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the state of affairs of the Company as at 31st March, 2025, and profit and loss statement for the year ended on that date.

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit of the financial statements in accordance with the Standards on Auditing (SAs) specified under Section 143(10) of the Act. Our responsibilities under those SAs are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Standalone Financial Statements section of our report. We are independent of the Company in accordance with the Code of Ethics issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India together with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the standalone financial statements under the provisions of the Act and the Rules there under, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the Code of Ethics. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Information Other than the Financial Statements and Auditors' Report Thereon

The Company's Board of Directors is responsible for the other information. The other information comprises the information included in the Annual report, but does not include the financial statements and our auditor's report thereon.

Our opinion on the financial statements does not cover the other information and we do not express any form of assurance conclusion thereon.

In connection with our audit of the financial statements, our responsibility is to read the other information and, in doing so, consider whether such other information is materially inconsistent with the financial statements or our knowledge obtained in the audit or otherwise appears to be materially misstated. If, based on the work we have performed, we conclude that there is a material misstatement of this other information, we are required to report that fact.

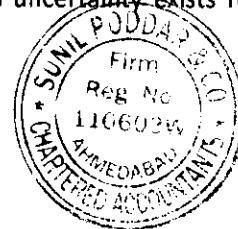
The board of directors are responsible for overseeing the company's financial reporting process.

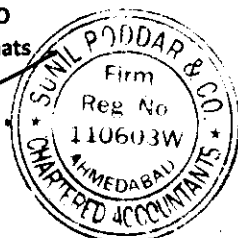

SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES AND NOTES TO ACCOUNTS

CORPORATE INFORMATION

S.D. ECOTECH PRIVATE LIMITED [CIN: U25209UP2019PTC123840] is a private limited company incorporated on November 26, 2019 with the Registrar of Companies, Kanpur. The company has been promoted by Mrs. SHARDA DEVI and Mr. VINAY AGARWAL. The company was incorporated with an object of Manufacturing of HDPE/MDPE Pipes.

BASIS OF PREPARATION

The Financial Statements of the Company have been prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles in India (Indian GAAP). The Company has prepared these Financial Statements to comply in all material respects, with the Accounting Standards notified under the Companies (Accounting Standards) Rules, 2006, (as amended) and the relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 2013. The Financial Statements have been prepared on an accrual basis and under the historical cost convention.

The Company is a Small and Medium Sized Company (SMC) as defined in the Companies (Accounting Standards) Rules, 2021 notified under the Companies Act, 2013. Accordingly, the Company has complied with the Accounting Standards as applicable to a Small and Medium Sized Company.

The accounting policies adopted in the preparation of financial statements are consistent with those of previous year except for the change in accounting policy, if any explained below.

1. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

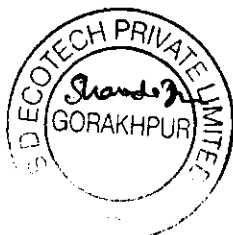
(i) Basis for Accounting

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention on an accrual basis of accounting in accordance with the Generally Accepted Accounting Principles, Accounting Standards notified under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 and the relevant provisions thereof.

(ii) Use of Estimates and Judgments

In preparation of the financial statements, the Company is required to make judgments, estimates and assumptions about the carrying amount of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. The estimates and the associated assumptions are based on historical experience and other factors that are considered to be relevant. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The estimates and the underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognized in the period in which the estimate is revised and future periods affected. Significant judgments and estimates about the carrying amount of assets and liabilities include useful lives of tangible and intangible assets, impairment of tangible assets,



intangible assets including goodwill, investments, employee benefits and other provisions and recoverability of deferred tax assets.

(iii) Valuation Of Inventories:

Stock in trade is valued at cost or net realizable value whichever is less.

The cost of inventory is determined on weighted average cost formula method on relevant categories of inventories on a consistent basis after providing for obsolete and defective inventories wherever necessary.

(iv) Revenue Recognition:

All known income and expenditure quantifiable till the date of finalization of accounts are accounted on accrual basis when virtual certainty is established.

(1) Revenue from Operation:

Sales revenue is recognized when property in the goods with all risk rewards and effective control of goods usually associated with ownership are transferred to buyer at price. Sales comprise of manufacturing and trading sales and are exclusive of excises, duties and local taxes and sales returns.

The various Discounts and rate differences on the Sales those accepted/rejected are accounted in the year of settled with the party, however if the same is of material amount effecting the current year profit/loss are separately shown under the Prior Period head of the profit and loss account.

(2) Other operational revenue

Other operational revenue represent income earned from the activities incidental to the business and is recognized when the right to receive the income is established as per the terms of the contract.

(3) Other Income:

Interest income is recorded at accrued or due which ever earlier at applicable interest rate. Other items of income are accounted as and when the right to receive arises.

(v) Fixed Asset:

(1) Tangible Fixed Assets:

Fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation, Cost comprises purchase price including import duties and other non-refundable taxes or levies, expenditure incurred in the course of construction or acquisition, Administrative and other general overhead expenses that are directly attributable costs of bringing the asset to its working condition for the purpose of use for the business.

(2) Capital Work in progress:

Tangible and intangible assets not ready for intended use on the date of balance sheet are disclosed as capital work in progress. The company has no assets under work in progress during the period covered under audit.



(3) Base of measurement followed by the Company is "Cost Model."

(vi) Intangible Assets:

There are no intangible assets with the company during the period covered under audit.

Base of measurement followed by the Company is "Cost Model."

(vii) Depreciation:

The property, plant and equipment are stated at cost, less accumulated depreciation and impairment, if any. Cost directly attributable to acquisition is capitalized until the property, plant and equipment are ready for use, as intended by the management. The company depreciates property, plant and equipment over their estimated useful lives using SLM method. The useful lives taken for the purpose of depreciation of different assets are prescribed as follows.

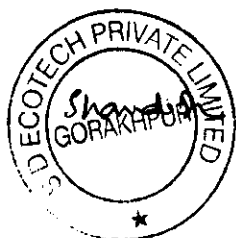
Management believes that the useful lives as given above represent the period over which the management expect to use these assets. Depreciation method, useful lives and residual values are reviewed periodically, including at each financial each financial year end.

(viii) Sundry Debtors:

Bad debts are accounted in the books, and are to be charged to revenue, as and when they arise.

(ix) Impairment of Tangible and intangible assets:

The Management periodically assesses using, external and internal sources, whether there is an indication that an asset may be impaired. An impairment loss is recognized wherever the carrying value of an asset exceeds its recoverable amount. The recoverable amount is higher of the asset's net selling price and value in use, which means the present value of future cash flows expected to arise from the continuing use of the asset and its eventual disposal. An impairment loss for an asset is reversed if, and only if, the reversal can be related objectively to an event occurring after the impairment loss was recognized. The carrying amount of an asset is increased to its revised recoverable amount, provided that this amount does not exceed the carrying amount that would have been determined (net of any accumulated amortization or depreciation) had no impairment loss been recognized for the asset in prior years.



(x) Investments:

The Investments are valued at cost of acquisition. The investment is of long term non trade, hence the provision for reduction in the value of investment is provided unless the same is permanent. There is no specific restriction for the investment.

(xi) Provisions and Contingent liabilities:

Provisions are recognized when the present obligation of the past event gives rise to a probable outflow embodying economic benefits on settlement, and the amount of obligation can be reliably estimated.

Contingent liabilities are disclosed after careful evaluation of facts and legal aspects of the matter involved.

Provisions and contingent liability are reviewed at each balance sheet date and adjusted to reflect the current best estimates.

(xii) Retirement Benefits

The company does not have eligible employees for the payment of gratuity and other retirement benefits, the same has not been provided.

(xiii) Provision for Current and Deferred Tax:

Taxes on Income are computed using tax deferral Assets or Liability method where taxes accrue in the same period, the respective revenue and expenses arise. The differences that result between the profit offered for income tax and the profit as per financial statements are identified and Deferred Tax Liability is recognized for timing difference, that originate in one accounting period and reverse in another based on the tax effect of the prevailing enacted regulation in force.

Deferred Tax Assets are recognized subject to prudence, only, if there is reasonable certainty that they will be realized and are subject to appropriate reviews at each balance sheet date for the purpose of measurement of Deferred Tax Liability or Assets, the applicable tax rates and enacted regulations expected to apply in the year in which the temporary differences are expected to be recovered or settled are applied.

(xiv) Foreign currency transaction:

- a) Transaction denominated in foreign currencies is normally recorded at the exchange rate prevailing at the time of the transaction.
- b) Monetary items denominated in foreign currencies at the yearend are restated at year end rates. In case of monetary items which are covered by forward exchange contract, the difference between the yearend rate and rate on the date of contract is recognized as exchange difference and the premium paid on forward contract has been recognized over the life of the contract if the forward contract is entered.
- c) Any income or expense on account of exchange difference either on settlement or on translation at the yearend rate is recognized in the profit and loss account except in cases when they relate to acquisition of fixed assets in which case they are adjusted to the carrying cost of such asset.



- d) The premium or discount on the Forward Exchange Contract entered into hedge foreign currency risk of an existing asset / liability is recognized / amortized as an income / expense over the life of the contract in the statement of profit and loss account for the trade transaction and capitalized to the asset in case the same is capital expenditure.
- e) In respect of branches, which are integral foreign operations, all transactions are translated at rates prevailing on the date of transaction or that approximates the actual rate at the date of transaction. Branch monetary assets and liabilities are restated at the yearend rates.

(xv) Leases:

Assets taken on lease by the Company in its capacity as lessee, where the Company has substantially all the risks and rewards of ownership, are classified as finance lease. Such a lease is capitalized at the inception of the lease at lower of the fair value or the present value of the minimum lease payments and a liability is recognized for an equivalent amount. Each lease rental paid is allocated between the liability and the interest cost so as to obtain a constant periodic rate of interest on the outstanding liability for each year.

Lease arrangements where the risks and rewards incidental to ownership of an asset substantially vest with the lessor, are recognized as operating leases. Lease rentals under operating leases are recognized in the statement of profit and loss on a straight-line basis.

(xvi) Borrowing Cost:

Borrowing cost directly attributable and/or funds borrowed generally and used for the purpose of acquisition/construction of an asset that necessarily takes a substantial period of time to get ready for its intended use are capitalized, at its capitalization rate to expenditure on those assets, for the period, until all activities necessary to prepare qualifying assets for its intended use are complete. All other borrowing costs are recognized as an expense in the year in which they are incurred.

(xvii) Net Profit or loss, Prior Period Items and Change in Accounting Policies

The disclosure of change in the accounting policies and the change in the accounting estimates is done as and when it is required. The prior period expense and the extraordinary items in the financial statement are recorded separately and details are given as and when they are in Financial Statement.

(xviii) Earnings Per Share:

Basic Earnings Per share are calculated by dividing the net profit or loss for the period attributable to equity shareholders by the weighted average number of Equity shares outstanding during the period.

For the purpose of calculation of Diluted Earnings per share, the net profit or loss for the period attributable to equity shareholders and the weighted average number of shares outstanding during the period are adjusted for the effect of all dilutive potential shares.

(xix) Cash & Cash Equivalents:
